What makes this school unique?


Arts are integrated into the entire academic curriculum * Teachers advance with their classes for consecutive years. Main lesson is 2 hours of academic instruction * Main lessons are subject specific and taught in 4-week blocks * Children make their own lesson books as readers * Lessons are taught in the oral tradition of storytelling * Special subjects fill the remainder of the day * Practical work is an integral part of the curriculum * Computers are used in later grades * Foreign language begins in kindergarten * Sciences are taught experientially * Humanities cover a full sweep of cultural heritage * Each child's reading and writing skills are assessed according to his or her developmental stage * 4-H Animal Program.

THE CURRICULUM

Kindergarten: In a nuturing, rhythmical environment, imagination and imitation are encouraged during activities such as morning circle, painting, modeling, bread baking, gardening, and storytelling

First Grade: + Fairy tales, nature stories from around the world + Reading approached through writing + Pictorial and phonetic review of letters + Qualities of numbers, introduction to the four processes in arithmetic, lower multiplication tables + Pentatonic flute begins



Second Grade: + Multicultural legends, folk tales, and fables + Reading, writing, elements of grammar + Arithmetic + Flute

Third Grade: + Ancient stories + Nature
Studies + Study of practical life: Farming,
housing, and clothing + Reading, spelling,
grammar, punctuation, parts of speech,
cursive writing, and composition
+ Multiplication tables, weights, measures,
money, and time. + Diatonic flute begins

Fourth Grade: + Mythologies and legends + Stories from California history + Composition, letter writing + Local geography and mapmaking + Study of animals + Fractions + Flute + Violin begins

Fifth Grade: + Greek myths, ancient civilizations through Greek times + Botany + American geography as related to vegetation, agriculture, and economics + Composition, grammar, spelling, and reading + Arithmetic, decimals, ratio, and proportion + Flute + Strings

Sixth Grade: + Roman and medieval history + European and African geography + Composition, grammar, spelling, reading, and biographies + Introduction to algebra, geometry + Botany, astronomy, mineralogy, physics, acoustics, electricity, magnetism, optics, and heat + Flute + Strings

Seventh Grade: + Arthurian legends,
voyages of discovery, the Renaissance
+ World geography + Composition,
grammar, spelling, and literature +
Arithmetic and pre-algebra + Mechanics,
organic and inorganic chemistry,
physiology, and astronomy + Flute + Strings

Eighth Grade: Literature, composition, grammar, and spelling + Arithmetic, algebra, and geometry + World economic geography + American history + Physics, hydraulics, organic chemistry, physiology, and meteorology + Flute + Strings

Special subjects: Music, foreign languages, dance, handwork, form drawing, painting, modeling, woodworking, drama, speech, gardening, and sports.
